

The correct way to use sometime, some time and sometimes

Sometime some time sometimes explained

Some time a period of time; quite a while but we don't know how long

Sometimes occasionally; now and then

Sometime at some unspecified time; someday

Sometime some time sometimes with examples

Some time	<p>Some time is written as 2 words.</p> <p>Some time means a period or length of time.</p> <p>We don't know how long it is, but it more than nothing and less than forever!</p>	<p>You know it takes some time to do that sort of thing.</p> <p>I think I'll spend some time listening to that old Britney Spears CD again.</p>
Sometimes	<p>Sometimes is an adverb of frequency. Think of it as halfway between never and always.</p> <p>Sometimes means occasionally or every now and then.</p>	<p>I sometimes walk my dog after dinner.</p> <p>Sometimes I am so tired I can't get out of bed!</p>
Sometime	<p>Sometime indicates a time in the future or the past which is not known or not stated.</p>	<p>They hoped to meet up sometime in the future.</p> <p>Shall we go for a coffee sometime?</p> <p>Let's go and see Peter sometime next week.</p>

Learning how to use *sometime*, *some time*, *sometimes*, correctly with examples

SOMETIMES , SOME TIME, SOMETIME

Sometimes - this means occasionally or every now and then. It is an adverb of frequency. It is more than never but less than always.

Sometimes I have noodles for lunch. Some days I have noodles for lunch, other days I don't.

Sometimes she likes to watch a movie after work. Some days she watches a movie after work, some days she doesn't.

Some time - when it is written as 2 words some time means a period or length of time. We don't know how long it is, but we know it's more than nothing but less than forever!

He has been working at IBM for some time. He has been working at IBM for a length of time (but we don't know exactly how long).

They have been together for some time, maybe they will get married soon. They have been together for a length of time (but we don't know or say for how long).

Sometime - this means at some point in time, when exactly is not known or not given.

Sometime in the future we'll meet again. We'll meet again in the future, but we don't know when.

Shall we go for coffee sometime? Shall we meet up for coffee at some point in the future?
